It demands, too, that they be animated by such love as will make them feel the needs of others as their own, and induce them to share their goods with others... Nor is this enough; for human society thrives on freedom, namely, on the use of means which are consistent with the dignity of its individual members."

Does our love and compassion inspire goodness in others?

Are our laws and policies consistent with the dignity of each individual member? Let's pray today for the grace to continue the mission that John XXIII gave to us.
